Uniting minds, igniting possibilities

The 17th edition of the Brussels Days converges the vibrant spirit of Brussels with the boundless energy of Madrid and Barcelona.

From 18 to 22 September 2023, a delegation of Brussels-based players from the creative and tourism industries will meet with Spanish and Catalan businesses, politicians, and cultural stakeholders. Set against the dynamic backdrop of Spain, this major international event promises to spark an x-factor between three captivating and non-conformist European cities.

The delegation is led by Rudi Vervoort, Minister-President of the Brussels-Capital Region and Ans Persoons, Secretary of State of the Brussels-Capital Region, responsible for European and international relations and Foreign Trade. Brussels Days x Spain aims to foster high-level networking opportunities, spotlight economic dynamism, creativity, cultural richness, gastronomy, and the tourism potential of Brussels.

Why Spain, you ask? Brussels x Spain share a rich past, a vibrant present, and the desire for a sustainable European future. Brussels x Madrid are sister cities, twinned, did you know? And Brussels x Barcelona are as closely linked as Catalan modernism and Brussels Art Nouveau.

The Brussels Days' choice of Spain aligns with several priority sectors in the Brussels-Capital Region. As the 10th largest destination for Brussels goods and Belgian services, Spain's significance as a trading partner cannot be understated. And with thriving economies and diversified sectors, both the Brussels-Capital Region and Catalonia stand as economic powerhouses.

One of the most compelling economic threads that bind Brussels x Spain is tourism. Spain's remarkable position as the 3rd largest market for Brussels in terms of tourism cements a strong connection that beckons exploration.

Brussels x Spain have been closely working together on the European stage, notably on sustainability, as Belgium takes over the baton from Spain as president of the Council of the European Union in January 2024.

Starting off our journey in Madrid with an evening reception at the Ambassador's residence, we meet the main characters of the capital's success story as a thriving film destination. Female entrepreneurs in various fields take the centre stage throughout our four-day programme, making for empowering exchanges. After a swift train ride to Barcelona, we proceed to explore opportunities to enrich the tourism landscape and engage in discussions on fintech, sustainable architecture and decarbonisation in this city renowned for its competitiveness and innovation.

Finally, the inauguration of the second Brussels House in Barcelona will set the promise of a future built upon shared visions in stone.

Born on 20 November 1958 to a Dutch-speaking father and a French-speaking mother, Rudi Vervoort is what is typically called a "zinneke" (a person of mixed origin). From a very young age, he followed current events and the political debate with passion thanks to his subscription to the daily Le Soir, which he asked his parents to get for him when he was in his teens. This enthusiasm for public affairs led him in particular to become president of the "Cercle de Droit" (law union) at the French-speaking Free University of Brussels (ULB) when he was a student. His political commitment then came naturally, because "when you study law, you understand very quickly the left/right stakes". Rudi became member of the Socialist Party at the age of 22.

In 1989, he was elected municipal councillor in Evere, the municipality where he grew up and where he still lives. An alderman in 1993, he exercised his duties in sport, education, culture, then finance, before becoming mayor in 1998.

In 1999, he was elected regional deputy and entered the brussels Parliament. At the same time, he assumed the leadership of the Socialist Party and succeeded Philippe Moreaux.

The ever quiet and thoughtful appearance hides a devotee of the pleasures of life? A lover of good food and an unconditional fan of classical and contemporary rock music (Rolling Stones, Led Zeppelin, Radiohead, dEUS,...). Rudi attends various festivals every year such as Rock Werchter. He is also a nature lover and a touring enthusiast. He climbed Mount Kilimanjaro in 2009.

Since he arrived at the head of the Government of the Brussels-Capital Region in May 2013, Rudi Vervoort has given new impetus to governmental action. Keen to take up the challenges faced by the Region, the Minister-President has left his imprint on the Government of Brussels.

His efforts during the 2014-2019 legislature convinced the denizens of Brussels, since they placed their trust in him in large numbers during the elections in May 2019. Rudi Vervoort heads the Government until the next elections in May 2024. The Minister-President continues to see through the projects he identified as taking priority in order to approve the daily life if the people of Brussels. The major stakes include, by way of example, the ecological challenges, urban development, the improvement of the employment rate for the city' inhabitants, the development of multimodal mobility, the construction and renovation of housing units and the improvement of the Region's image in Belgium and abroad.



Atomium



Brussels' major symbol

The Atomium is an international tourist attraction. This unique piece of architecture was designed for the Brussels World Fair (Expo 58), of which it was the flagship building, and is now one of the most popular attractions in the European capital.

The question that often springs to mind when you see it is: what does it represent? The monument on the Heysel plateau depicts an iron crystal magnified 165 billion times. This idea refers to the power of atomic energy, which was in full development in the 1950s.

Renovated as part of a nationwide campaign between 2004 and 2006, the Atomium - which was meant to be removed Expo 58 - is now, with over 600,000 visitors a year, the European capital's most popular tourist attraction, an art centre and the international symbol of Brussels and Belgium.


Aux Armes de Bruxelles, follow the guide!

Paladenberg



Once upon a time, the Coudenberg Palace towered over the city of Brussels. Charles V and many other of the most powerful rulers ever to reign in Europe made this princely residence their home between the 12th and 18th centuries, until it was consumed by a terrible fire. Every trace of this prestigious palace simply disappeared underground for many years. Today, however, these ruins constitute a fascinating archeological site incorporating a network of underground passages and chambers.

When you visit The Coudenberg Palace, you can explore the principal buildings of the palace and enjoy a stroll along the Rue Isabelle, which is now underground. In the Coudenberg Museum, located in Hoogstraeten House, the finest of the archeological discoveries made during the various excavations of the Coudenberg site are displayed.

Located on the Heysel plateau, next to the Atomium, the Design Museum Brussels, initiated by the Atomium's acquisition of a collection by the Atomium, is dedicated to 20th-century and contemporary design today. Favoring a historical approach, its ambition is to make design understandable and accessible to all audiences. Much more than a simple formal, aesthetic and functional object, design design is the witness of an era that the museum aims to share. A place to meet, discover and share, the Design Museum Brussels promotes these multiple dimensions of design through its collection, exhibitions and outreach activities.



Furopean Parlament



The European Parliament is the seat of democracy in the European Union, representing 500 million people. Seeing it with your own eyes is a great way to find out about how it works as the voice of Europe's citizens.

In Brussels, visitors can explore the Hemicycle and attend a talk with European Parliament experts. In the Parlamentarium, Europe's largest parliamentary visitors centre, they can discover more about the path towards European integration and how the European Parliament works. Finally, they can go on a journey through the history of the continent in the House of European History.

It's a fantastic opportunity to learn more about the European Union and its institutions, thanks to the many facilities on offer. You'll also find out how Spain's Presidency of the Council of the European Union will work in the second half of 2023.

All activities are free of charge, and most are available in each of the European Union's 24 official languages. They can be adapted according to the age, interest and profile of the group, upon request. Details can be found on the European Parliament visitors' website.

Slated to open in 2025, it is situated in a converted Citroën factory by place de l'Yser. Since 2018, KANAL has been building an ambitious off-site programme and a collection of contemporary art, in anticipation of the opening. With its 40,000m² space, KANAL promises to be one of the largest museums of modern and contemporary art in Europe.

Occupying galleries, auditoria and public spaces across and around the building, KANAL's programme of exhibitions, live events and new productions bringing together established and emerging artists, will be conceived for and with our audiences. The programme will embrace art which crosses disciplines from music to film, painting to digital media, sculpture to performance. It will reflect the central position that time-based media, performance, immersive experience and participation occupy in contemporary art, tracing the history of pioneering art practices throughout 20th century.

Interdisciplinarity and diversity at the heart of the project

The KANAL Collection focuses on 21st century art by artists living and working in Brussels and Belgium. Reflecting KANAL's commitment to interdisciplinarity, the collection embraces all media, from painting, sculpture, drawing and prints to photography, film, video, installations, performances and archive material. It aims to represent the diversity of the Belgian artistic scene and the complexity of contemporary art practices. KANAL aspires to make this ever-growing collection accessible to the broadest audience possible. The artworks will form an essential part of the future programme of exhibitions and collection displays. Loans to other institutions and an online presence and contextualisation serve the same purpose.


The whole of Europe animated in miniature!







BI consists of four departments:

• The External Relations Department

This department coordinates:

- the Region's bilateral relations with cities, provinces and regions all over the world, essentially based on cooperation agreements;
- the development cooperation policy;
- the participation in the policy-making of international organisations, either in the frame of the interfederal coordination (e.g. Coormulti) so as to decide on the Belgian stance, or through direct participation in activities that are of interest to the BCR;
- the participation in the activities of European and international networks of which the Region is a member and whose mission is to address urban and regional challenges;
- the follow-up of procedures for signing and giving assent to European and international treaties;
- the contribution to the monitoring mechanisms of international organisations (reports, fact-finding missions, collective complaints, etc.) and various other tasks arising from treaty obligations.

• The Public Relations, Communication and Protocol Department

This department coordinates:

- the Region's participation in major events;
- the communication;
- the public relations and the protocol (during missions abroad and when hosting delegations);
- the organisation of business trips abroad for the staff of the BRPS and the ministerial cabinets.

• The Europe Department

This department coordinates:

- the participation in European policies and their follow-up, from legislative proposals and negotiations within the Council of the European Union up to implementation within the Region;
- the Brussels Capital Region delegation within the Permanent Representation of Belgium to the EU, which defends the interests of the Brussels Capital Region in all the Council configurations for which it is competent, and which supports the regional ministers who sit on the Council;
- the application of European law in regional law (transpositions, infringements, etc.);
- managing of the European dossiers involving every competency (European Semester, Recovery and Resilience Facility, multiannual financial framework, among other things);
- monitoring European territorial cooperation programmes (Interreg) and supporting project development.

• The ERDF Department (European Regional Development Fund)

• This department supports very specific projects to strengthen the Region's economic, social and territorial cohesion, using European and Brussels funds. It oversees the implementation and monitoring of ERDF operational programmes in the BCR. It is in contact with the European institutions as well as regional and local players, drawing on the expertise of other regional government departments, regional partners, fund beneficiaries and other Belgian and European regions. • The Licence Cell

• This cell deals with matters relating to the granting of licences for the import, export and transit of weapons, dual-use goods and technologies, a competency devolved to the regions since 2003. More information: http://du-arms.brussels
